Direct and Indirect Subsidies Are Provided by New Yorkers in Exchange for Our Right to Free Admission

Evidence of New Yorkers' generosity and compliance with the economic understanding of the PPP is demonstrated in the granting to BCM-BIOAS of an approximate \$8.3 MILLION in direct and indirect subsidies for 2018 and \$8.0 MILLION in 2017. Additionally, \$54.8 MILLION has been invested in BCM-BIOAS's physical plant during the timeframe of 2000 through 2018, with \$245 THOUSAND and \$163 THOUSAND granted in 2017 and 2018, respectively.
