## Direct and Indirect Subsidies Are Provided by New Yorkers in Exchange for Our Right to Free Admission

Evidence of New Yorkers' generosity and compliance with the economic understanding of the PPP is demonstrated in the granting to NYHSCI of **\$8.7 MILLION** and **\$9.0 MILLION** in 2018 and 2017, respectively. Additionally, **\$86.1 MILLION** has been invested in NYHSCI's physical plant through 2018. [The timeframe during which New Yorkers' **\$86.1 MILLION** physical plant investment was made is unknown because the amount is cumulative, and the auditors did not provide a beginning date.]
