## Direct and Indirect Subsidies Are Provided by New Yorkers in Exchange for Our Right to Free Admission

Evidence of New Yorkers' generosity and compliance with the economic understanding of the PPP is demonstrated in the granting to SIZ of an approximate \$3.2 MILLION in 2017 and \$3.3 MILLION in 2018. Additionally, City leaders funneled \$2.5 MILLION and \$4.5 MILLION in direct taxpayer dollars to fund capital expenditures in 2017 and 2018. [Research did not uncover a SIZ audited financial statement. The amounts reported were extracted from ZIS's unaudited IRS Form 990.]
